A Reading from Luke 19:28-40 — After telling a parable to the crowd at Jericho, Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethphage & Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village ahead of you. As you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks, 'Why are you untying it?' just say, 'The Lord needs it.'' So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked, "Why are you untying the colt?" They said, "The Lord needs it." Then they brought it to Jesus; & after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. When he approached the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Eucharistic Minister leads the Prayers of the People (Adapted: Bob Dylan, How many roads?) How many roads must a man walk down Before you call him a man? Lord Jesus, we call you both Man and God: show us that you are here with us on every busy, brutal, lonely or friendly road that we walk down. How many seas must a white dove sail Before she sleeps in the sand? Spirit of God, it is not Your way to rest in the sand: Renew and strengthen us to reach out in both light and darkness, in care and compassion. Yes, and how many times must the cannonballs fly Before they're forever banned? O Creator God: Since the very beginning, your creatures have sought dominance and control that boils over in violence and war. Help us make peace daily within ourselves that we may wage peace in your world.
